My dear students, colleagues and friends:

I want to thank each one of you assembled here for being with us on this august occasion. We are going to plant several trees today. Two years ago, we planted about 350 trees. Most of them have survived, thanks to Shri Praveen Srivastava and his team. This year, we have Dr. Bilga and his team, who have been working hard for the last several days to help us plan trees today. I request each one of you to participate in this exercise. Planting the trees is the first job and perhaps the easiest. To look after them and to make sure that they all survive is much more difficult. Please adopt a tree and look after it during your stay at IISER Mohali. You can come back years later and show your children and the grand children that you looked after it and it is yielding fruits and flowers that day. Use the trees as your role model. For the little we give them, they give a lot in return. Each one of you must give as much as possible to the Nation. Then India will emerge as No. 1 in the comity of Nations and you will be proud to have contributed your bit.
