I feel sad that books are missing from our library. I don't want to treat our students as thieves. I don't want to frisk them. I don't want to restrict the library hours. I hope that they will conduct themselves worthy of the trust reposed on them. May be we should switch to e-books. That will stop stealing of books.

I want to wish each one of you all the best in your endeavour. I would like to see each one of you doing your best. When that happens, IISER Mohali will be the best.
