ink between philosophy, science traced

chandigarh: A two-day national seminar on the relevance of philosophy in the era of science and technology began on Monday at the ICSSR Complex of Panjab University (PU) in Chandigarh.

The PU Department of Philosophy is organising the event. On the first day of the seminar, department chairperson Dr H.P. Sah elaborated on deliberations coming up during the seminar and how the delegates will address the intimate connection between philosophy and science and how technology was impacting the domains of knowledge.

Professor Yashpal, scientist, educationalist and Chancellor of Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU), New Delhi, inaugurated the seminar and said philosophy should not be isolated passion and it should emerge from everyday life of people.

"Philosophy represents attitude of knowing about nature,

He elaborated on the importance of philosophy in liberat-

> ing the human mind from the yoke of superstition and metaphysical belief.

In the second academic session, Prof Harjinder Singh Laltu from the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Hyderabad, spoke on the crisis of dialogue between proponents of science and social science on the one hand and philosophers on the other.

Prof Laltu said philosophy was a creative and intellectual activity for addressing the diverse dimensions of human condition, but it should not remain armchair intellectual exercise. "It should turn into a fruitful activity where the project of modernity can be realised and human emancipation can be made possible," he said.

At the third afternoon session chaired by Professor Bhuvan Chandel, presentations were made by Professor Omam Bhagat from the JNU, Dr Ambuj Sharma of Dev Samaj College in Ferozepur and Prof Shashi Bala from Guru Nanak Dev University in Amritsar.
